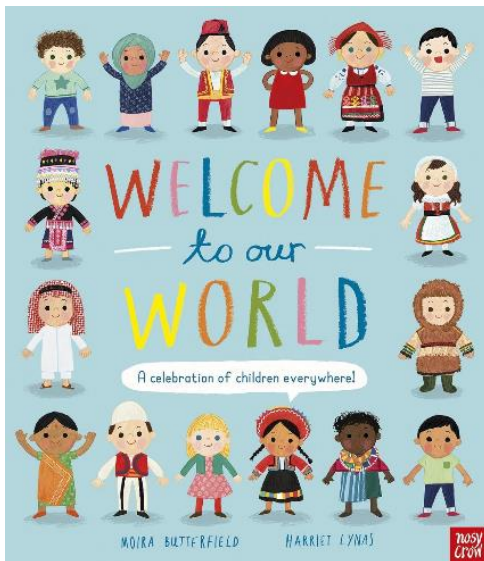
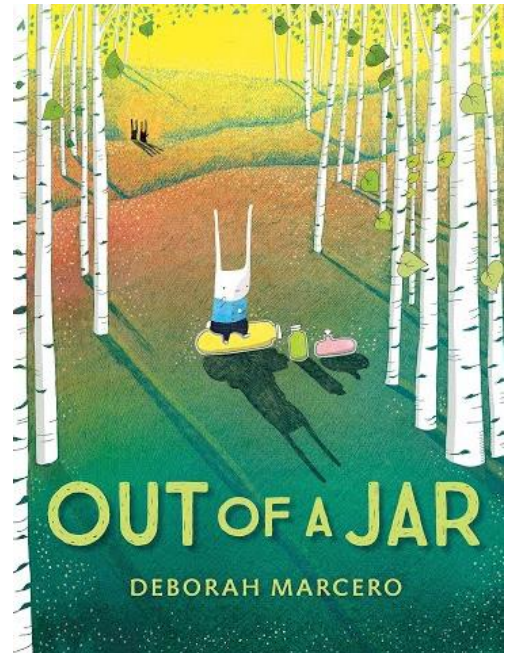


Following on from our learning about The Colour Monster we have learnt this week why we need to have our emotions and how we can have different emotions at the same time. We have made rainbow sticks with wool on lollypop sticks. We have learnt how to use the sound mat to find the start of sounds that we can hear when writing. Each child has used their current phonics knowledge to write these sounds. They all impressed us so much. We have also used pipettes to make squirty paint pictures of all of the emotion colours, to celebrate all of the emotions together. We mixed two primary colours together in jars to make our colour emotion change into another colour. The children have also been making emotion faces out of playdough and drawing The Colour Monsters. We have been practicing our number formation and using number puzzles for our 1:1 correspondence for counting.



This week we have practiced the story that we will be retelling and the songs we will sing during the Harvest Festival Assembly on Monday.
