WB 29th September

This week we our learning has been focussed around Harvest. We have talked about the meaning of harvest and how Christians celebrate during the Harvest festival.

The children have explored and drawn a selection of vegetables. They have created their own pumpkin prints, using chopped apples. They have made lolly pop scarecrows and practiced their cutting skills to make a farmers field.







This week in phonics we have been introduced to the new sound: g,o,c and k. We have also been introduced to some tricky words. (These are words that the children can not sound out but have to learn to recognise.) put, of, and is

This week in maths the children have been using number fans to match the number or fingers held up or the number of spots on a rolled dice. They also looked at different ways of making 5, with teddies hiding under a blanket. We sand 5 little ducks and looked at the different ways of making 5 with ducks in and out of the water. Lastly we have explored 10 frames and used them to help us find the missing amount to make 10.

From next week we will be sending home two books on a Wednesday; a phonics book and a story book and on Friday we will be changing the story book only. The children will all be ready to access the phonics book in their own way. Some children will be able to tell you some of the sounds they recognise, some children will listen to you sound the words ie. C-a-t and be able to blend them to hear the word and some children will be happy to look at the pictures and talk about what they can see. From the newsletters you will be able to know which sounds the children have been introduced to each week so you can point these out in the books too.
