



Our topic activities for this week have been based around the story of 'The Teeny Weeny Tadpole'. The children used split pins to create moving frogs, in maths they put frogs in order of size, completed a frog life cycle and used junk modelling to collectively within their group create a habitat for their make believe tadpoles.
