I hope everyone had a lovely break, it has been lovely hearing all the amazing stories from Christmas. This term we are learning about superheroes and real-life heroes. We began the week learning about Sir David Attenborough, from this we have learnt ways we can protect our planet. Wrens have been learning about recycling and why it is important. During activities, Wrens have been making bird cake to feed the birds. They have created stop littering posters and played in a small world with seeds and animals.

This week in phonics we have been reviewing previous sounds and have learnt one new sound:

'oo' (book)

In maths this week Wrens have been understanding the 'one more than/one less than' relationship between consecutive numbers. We have done this through counting while putting objects into a bin then predicting what number is next. Counting characters in 'The Gingerbread Man' using giant blocks and singing 'Five Little Ducks went Swimming'.



We wanted to give you plenty of notice for the trip we are planning this year. As we did last year, Jays and Wrens would like to go on a trip together. This year we will focus on land animals as part of our science topic by visiting Wildwood Park in Sturry on 23rd June. We have looked at prices for this, to include entry to the park and the coach journey. The price for this will be £13 per child. The park also offers tours or a chance for the class to focus on one of the animals and find out a bit about them. We would love to do this but it would put the price up to £14.50 per child.
