As the year goes on, children should build up their know ledge of phase 5 sounds and alternative ways to write them, too. * Revisiting the sounds which many children still found tricky to remember from Wrens - ai (as in train) igh (as in night) oa (as in float) ar (as in star) and ur (as in turn.) * We practised forming c, d, e and f. As last week, all of these letters should begin with the same basic movement.
Maths	Place value within 10 * One more and one less. I have set an activity on Seesaw to help children practise this if they would like to. * Comparing groups. * Exploring the language of fewer, more and the same.
