This week we have been learning about:

English	<p>Editing writing - looking out for finger spaces, capital letters and full stops. Handwriting focus - descenders below the writing line and the formation of curly caterpillar letters. Phonics - sh sound from various graphemes (&lt;ti&gt; &lt;sti&gt;) Writing a journal entry about the fun filled activities of our last week of the term: fruit kebabs, crazy golf course and computing fun!</p>
Maths	<p>Measurement: practical activities exploring capacity and volume: Measuring using a giant testube and non standard measure of cubes We have looked at too.</p>
Other Subjects	<p>Music: practising song with actions for Easter service PE: crazy golf - we had a lot of fun putting golf skills to test when our classroom was transformed into a crazy golf course. Dodging and weaving while running - we tried to keep hold of our rugby tags on our belts. RE: What impact does the Easter story have on many Christians? Art: We used fine motor to complete two drawing workshops to create cartoon characters to add to our golf hole challenges made from junk modelling. DT: tasting, designing and enjoying a fruit kebab. So many new fruits were tasted. Computing: Grouping information and answering questions about it - a lot of activity on the laptops.</p>

PE days next term will be PE on a Tuesday and swimming on a Wednesday. Please wear PE kits (with sports shoes that provide support to the foot - no fashion eg high-tops), on a Wednesday please ensure that earrings are removed and you bring swimming kits (you might want to include a pair of clogs or sliders for ease of walking to/from the pool) goggles and swim caps can also be worn.
