This week we have been learning about:	
English	Creating a stunning diamante poem - cleverly chosen language (using language through colour to help us choose the correct word class for each line). Performing a poem (look out for the videos on seesaw). Reading - we are nearing the end of our class reader 'the Owl who was Afraid of the Dark'. We also enjoyed sharing poetry readings. Friday diary - focus on punctuation in our diary writing about Harvest Festival.
Maths	Place value: skip counting in 2, 5 and 10. Reminder of our number bonds to ten then relating these fact to bonds to 20 and 100 Fact families: i.e. if I know that 5 + 8 = 13, then I know that 8 + 5 = 13, 13-8 = 5 and 13-5 = 8 Subitising and working on number bonds on NUMBOTS. Problem solving with number bonds Friday maths: naming 2d shapes - please practise pentagon, hexagon and octagon.
Science	Discussing the features of microhabitats and understanding why certain creatures chose one over another.
Other	PE: multiskills and swimming.
Subjects:	 Art: Focus on artist Charles McGee - making patterns using dots and circles, curved, straight and angled lines. PSHE: understanding our roles in friendship groups. How to be a supportive friend and understanding others. Computing: How computers are used (can you spot barcodes on any items at home or in a shop). RE: Who is the Prophet Muhammad* and why is he important to Muslims.
