HAPPY NEW YEAR! We hope you all had a good break over Christmas. It was lovely to see you all back in school. We've had a busy first week back.

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This week we have been learning about:	
English	Reading: answering retrieval questions on the topic of woodlands with a nice link to habitats and animals (papers were brought home). Reading a picture - the opening page of our new text "The Princess and the White Bear King". Describing the image and linking questions - what puzzles me is Making a crown and describing it with superlative 'est'. We have now planned a descriptive letter to persuade the King to choose it over others. These will be sent to Buckingham Palace! Empathising with a character and writing to Walter Tull about the terrible treatment during a football match at Bristol. Friday diary: 'back to school' with an emphasis on punctuation and handwriting.
Maths	Started a new unit on money and measurement. Recognising and counting pence and pounds Times table practise - x2 x5 and x10 (on paper/games and using numbots/TT rockstars) Measuring in centimeters
Science	Started new science topic - Animals including humans. Finding links between newly offspring and their parents - discussing changes in Humans as we grow (see homework task)
Other Subjects:	PE: introduction to dance - making shape to animals movement to the tune of 'circle of life'. Gymnastics - travelling in a variety of ways with light quiet steps. Art: Taking photos of objects around school with different textures - we will draw them next week. Music: How music makes me feel - listening to Holst's Saturn, Venus and Mars. Identifying instruments and sharing feelings. A first exploratory session of rhythm using Chrome Music lab - lots of fun! DT: we completed our reflection on our 'Bear Chair' constructed last term. We considered changes we might make if we were to draw another design. Languages: the Reyes Magos visited Owls class - we watched a clip of the celebrations in Madrid and enjoyed a sweet! RE: Beginning 'Gospel' topic: What did Jesus' good news mean for Matthew in the Bible story? Handwriting: we are focusing on the 'ea' join - diagonal join to anticlockwise letters this week.
