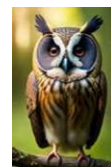


OWLS CLASS (Year 2) - Weekly overview

Friday 28 February 2025 This week we have been learning about:	
English	Reading - retrieval from extracts of books Started work on our new book 'The Emperor's Egg' - a beautifully illustrated information text on a Emperor Penguin Dad looking after an egg and the first days of an Emperor chick. Note taking on penguins Planning and writing a set of instructions: using imperative verbs and time openers Friday diary - starting sentences in different ways
Maths	Dividing by sharing and grouping Two times table (you all have a super speedy recall of these facts) Dividing by 2 An introduction to time
Science	'What makes a healthy plate?' - a balanced diet plate - identifying food groups & considering which ingredients on my pizza are healthy.
Other Subjects:	PE: Multi-skill circuits and an introduction to Pickle-ball (see seesaw for some photos) Geography: a special visit from Ometh's Mum - we learnt a lot about Sri Lanka - from the animals that live there and conservation projects, the significance of different buildings, religions and the art of picking tea-leaves. We also watched a short film of Ometh making coconut flat bread (and hope to make it in class next term) Art: making a coil (using playdough before we move on to clay). Computing: Collecting data as a tally RE: the start of Humanism unit: What is Humanism? Handwriting: we are focusing on mixed joins for three letters
