


Owls class (y2)

English	<p>Using everything we learnt last week when we wrote our non-chronological reports on crocodiles to write one about goldfish. Again we spent some time researching them thinking about their habitat, diet and appearance and learnt many interesting and (some) horrifying facts!</p> <p>We then independently planned and wrote our non-chronological reports.</p>
Maths	<p>Addition and subtraction:</p> <p>We completed our work on addition and subtraction with some problem solving and reasoning. For some of the problems we were working with 2 digit numbers and then for others we worked with 1 digit numbers.
