Robins class (y3)

Friday 20th September 2024: This week we have been... On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, using the book 'The Stone Age Boy', we reread and storymapped the book to become really familiar with the text and then we learnt how to use inverted commas to show direct speech as we wrote conversations between the main characters. At the end of the week, using the book 'Claude in the City', we read about some of Claude and Sir Bobblysock's adventures in the city before producing a map to show their journey and then writing a postcard home of the adventures we'd already had. Our spellings this week have all been words where the digraph 'ou' makes an /u/ sound: touch, double, country, trouble, young, cousin, enough, couple, encourage, flourish. Place Value: This week we have continued to work with numbers up to 1,000. We have found 1, 10 and 100 more or less, placed numbers on a number line, compared numbers using greater than, lesser than and equals and ordered lists of numbers upto 1,000 in ascending and descending order. Estimate where the numbers belong on the number line. Here are three numbers in base 10 250 550 850 990 100 200 300 400 500 600 700 $\,$ 900 $\,$ 1,000 $\,$ Write the numbers in order. Start with the smallest number. **SCIENCE** - We investigated the question - why do we use/need reflective surfaces? RE - We used the story of Noah's Ark to make links with how we would like the world to be and how we should live in it. We also produced a class covenant. Other Curriculum Areas ART - We used primary colours to mix different types of brown using powder paint, water colour and poster paints. MUSIC - We practiced B and introduced minims (2 beat notes) alongside crochets (1 beat notes). We also listened to the second part of Vivaldi's recorder concerto in C to help us answer the question what does largo mean? PE- Basketball - we worked on our passing skills to understand how passing is used in basketball. Spanish We are working on greetings.
