- Polite children
- Makes every child feel special/valued
- Inclusive

Suggestions/ideas to improve the school

Many of the comments were only mentioned by one parent but this point was raised by more than one of you:

- School dinners quality and quantity
- Communication about payments for trips/residential to be given sooner
- PE top change colour to blue instead of white because the children wear them more often and they get dirty

I am already monitoring school dinners and will be contacting CH & Co with my findings.

I have asked teachers to give more notice about payments and teachers will give you a guide in January to when trips are likely to be for the rest of the year with approximate costs.

Blue PE tops are a great idea and we hope to have these available in the summer for the next academic year. These will be phased in so that if you already have white T-shirts that fit your child, there will be no need to replace it with a blue one.

One parent raised the issue of the lack of sports competitions. This is something we would like to change and hope that in the new year we can take part in more district competitions. We have not been able to take part so far simply because we do not have any spare staff members to accompany the children.

A huge thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the survey. We were thrilled with the positive feedback. It was a real boost to all the staff.
