COVID update

Numbers of pupils testing positive are increasing slightly. We currently have 8 pupils who have tested positive. For the rest of this term, we will continue to inform you if a pupil in your child's class tests positive. The Department for Education guidance remains the same as it was last term; pupils who test positive should stay at home for 5 days and return to school after they have had two negative tests.

This guidance is likely to change after April 1st and we will update you at that time.

Ukraine

We are all shocked and saddened by the unfolding of events in Ukraine and we have given careful consideration to our approach in dealing with children's questions and concerns. It is clear that many of our older children have picked up various bits of information (and misinformation) about the invasion. Even if the children are shielded from the news at home, children talk about it on the playground and come across references on social media. Children in Y4 and above watch CBBC Newsround https://www.bbc.co.uk/newsround regularly and have watched child-appropriate information about the events that are happening in Ukraine.
