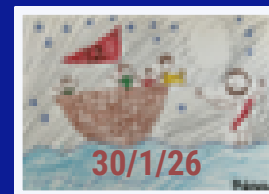

*The statistics paint a concerning picture – with children spending an average of 5 hours per day on screens and only 5 hours per week engaging in outdoor play. It's no wonder that a significant percentage of UK children only have the opportunity to play outdoors with other children at school.*

*The benefits of the OPAL programme are extensive, ranging from increased enjoyment of school to a reduction in teaching time lost due to conflicts between children, fewer accidents, and enhanced behavioural outcomes. These advantages stem from the fundamental understanding that children learn through play. OPAL embraces messiness, challenges, and increased freedoms in play which are essential for fostering children's physical and mental well-being, aligning with current guidelines on health, safety, and development.*
